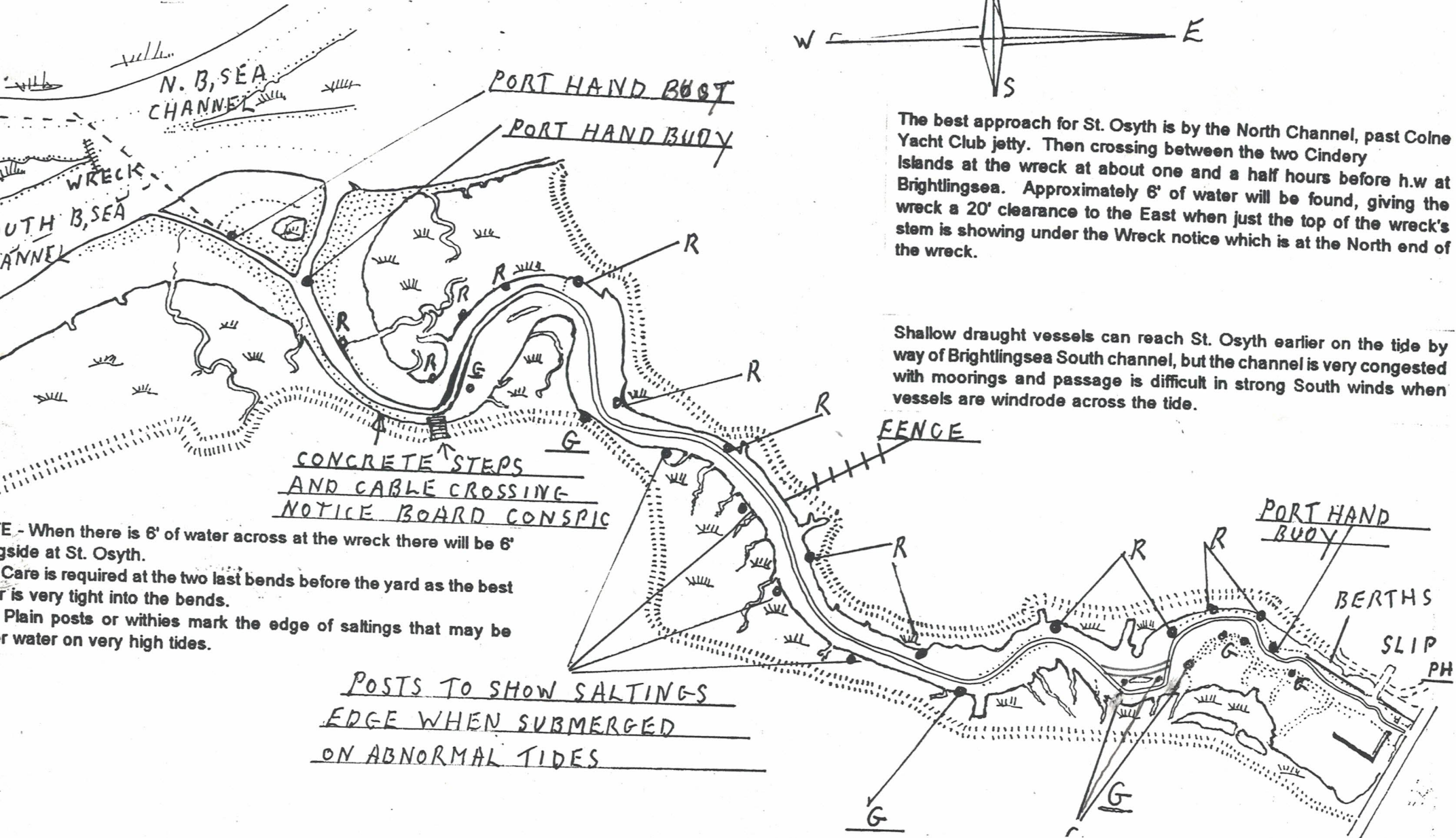
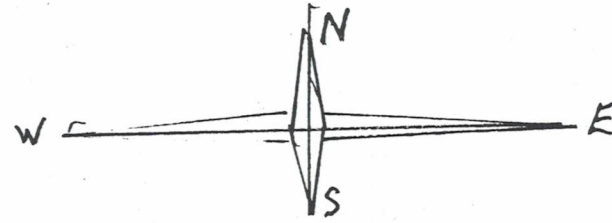


ST. OSYTH BOATYARD, St. Osyth, Clacton-on-sea, Essex

The best approach for St. Osyth is by the North Channel, past Colne Yacht Club jetty. Then crossing between the two Cindery Islands at the wreck at about one and a half hours before h.w at Brightlingsea. Approximately 6' of water will be found, giving the wreck a 20' clearance to the East when just the top of the wreck's stem is showing under the Wreck notice which is at the North end of the wreck.

Shallow draught vessels can reach St. Osyth earlier on the tide by way of Brightlingsea South channel, but the channel is very congested with moorings and passage is difficult in strong South winds when vessels are windrode across the tide.

E - When there is 6' of water across at the wreck there will be 6' inside at St. Osyth.

Care is required at the two last bends before the yard as the best is very tight into the bends.

Plain posts or withies mark the edge of saltings that may be over water on very high tides.
